Undergrads Push Campaign Toward Goal Line

This March eight undergraduates pledged to the capital campaign to put the project within \$50,000 of our \$1.2 million goal. "This speaks to the caliber of AGR men at K-State," said Bob Broeckelman '67, Campaign Chair. "It's no wonder that Alpha Zeta Chapter has been named a Gold Chapter by AGR National for six consecutive years."

"Serving as an officer in the undergraduate chapter has taught me the true value of this fraternity," said sophomore VNR of Alumni Relations, Garret Kays. "I have learned that my financial support to the campaign would inspire me to be part of AGR for not only four years, but a lifetime."

"I donated to ensure that the brothers that follow me have the same if not better

experience than I have had at Alpha Gamma Rho fraternity," said Denver Johnston.

Just this month, our undergrads have made headlines in Manhattan:

- KSU students elected Charles "Reagan" Kays, senior in agribusiness, as student body president, receiving over 85% of the vote! His platform issues are streamlining tutoring services, increasing communication with all 475 student organizations and advocating for a medical amnesty law. "I am most passionate about helping people and I want to do this for the rest of my

Dining With Donors Honors All Contributors

"In 2004, 298 donors saved Alpha Gamma Rho at Kansas State University," said Bob Broeckelman '67 to a crowd of alumni and undergraduates gathered for the *Dining With Donors* celebration February 28th. "Without their timely support of a renovated chapter house, led by Richard Chase, George Teagarden and others, we would have shuttered our doors like our former neighbor Kappa Sigma. Today we have the unique opportunity to honor 258 brothers who've helped put the icing on the cake. They've guaranteed our resurgence on campus by helping to eliminate our mortgage, complete needed renovations, and add to our scholarship fund. I can't think of a better time to be an AGR in Kansas."

Hosted at the Blue Hills Room, nearly 75 alumni, undergraduates and friends gathered to celebrate the campaign begun in 2011. Eunice Bradley, widow of former KSU professor and AGR alumnus Howard Bradley, was a special guest. Eunice, The Morgan Family, and Darrell Cardell have provided funds to support the Howard R. Bradley Agriculture Education Scholarship.

Campaign Achievements

- Having raised 95% of our goal, we've collected \$822,466, which exceeds our original mortgage debt. According to Treasurer Ben Brent '56, we're on course to retire our debt in 2017.

- Over 100 volunteers – representing alumni from the 1940s through 2000 initiates – have been recruited, trained and put to work to implement this historic fundraising effort.
- \$92,000 has been invested in chapter house renovations including carpeting, bathroom improvements, parking lot upgrades, security, installation of dining room cabinets and new furniture.
- Since 2011, \$43,000 in additional scholarships has been awarded at Pink Rose, and \$105,000 in new undergraduate awards have been created to honor specific brothers and friends.

Pink Rose Recognizes Undergraduates & Alumni Achievements

Attended by 150 undergrads, alumni, friends and family, Pink Rose 2014 featured scholarship awards, Hall of Fame inductions and "words-to-the wise" by George Teagarden '63. In 2012 the Back Patio at the Chapter House was named in honor of George by an anonymous donor given his many years of service as chapter advisor and Alumni Board President. "If I'm going to be involved in an organization," said George, "I want to participate."

In his remarks, George delivered three key points directly to the undergraduates:

1. Take responsibility for yourself while at college.
2. You have much to gain from your new family at Alpha Gamma Rho.
3. Make the most of your connections at college, including the fraternity, professors and mentors.

"When my son Wade first came to campus as a freshman, we ran into the Dean of the Ag School, who I knew well," said George. "We talked for some thirty minutes on the sidewalk. He encouraged Wade to get a broad education while at K-State, for in all likelihood, he would change jobs up to seven times in his lifetime. In essence, don't paint yourself into a corner, and be open to all possibilities. That was and is good advice. Right now, Wade's working on job number four. But I've definitely seen my share since college. I know for a fact that AGR brothers helped me get a job a couple of times, and the connections and knowledge that I was exposed to in my four years has been an asset my whole life."

Teagarden '63 and Burgess '61 Inducted into AZ Hall of Fame

Steve Burgess grew up on a farm in Sublette, Kansas. Behind the wheel of his Impala, Steve would race to Manhattan against fellow Sublette native John Nelson who drove a Corvette.

Both Brothers managed to survive the experience! Steve graduated in 1964 and then spent two years in the Peace Corps in Colombia, South America. In 1970, he went to work for Layne Western Co. and later became the district manager until 1982. In 1983, he began buying and building rental houses and apartments. After 31 years, Steve – arguably the largest landlord in Garden City - now owns and manages over 350 units. He also has a large horse arena for his Paso Fino horses.

In 1995 Steve started the AZ scholarship program. "A college education is becoming more and more expensive, and housing

is plentiful on and off campus. Having a scholarship program helps AGR be more competitive. As alumni, if we don't financially support the fraternity, things like this won't happen. I never thought of this as an active. But I definitely see its importance today. Being at Pink Rose and handing out these awards is very rewarding. Everyone has their projects they like to support. This is mine."

Steve and Ann Burgess have been married since 1970, and have two daughters and three stepdaughters.

George Teagarden '63

George Teagarden is a 1963 initiate. He was raised on a family farm in Linn County where he currently resides near LaCygne, Kansas. He spends his time tending a herd of 150 fall/spring cows. From 1981 to 1994, Teagarden served in the Kansas House of Representatives. After 16 years as the Kansas Livestock Commissioner, he retired in 2010. In 2008 Teagarden was awarded the KFB Distinguished Service to Agriculture Award for his leadership in agriculture. Since 1985 he has served on the board of the Kansas Junior Livestock Show. Of his time in AGR Steve says: "AGR taught me to meet and work with people to develop ideas for the betterment of the whole." George's son, Wade Teagarden #1171, is also an Alpha Zeta AGR.

Randy Stoecker '66 Early Campaign Supporter

Although Randy Stoecker's career in the hog business has taken him far from his humble roots, AGR at K-State has remained near and dear to his heart. Randy grew up on a farm near Oakley, Kansas and is a 1970 KSU graduate with a degree in Agricultural Economics. He

was President of Murphy-Brown Western Operations, a division of Smithfield Foods, where he was responsible for pork production systems in nine states. He worked with PIC prior to joining the Murphy team in North Carolina as Vice-President of Production in 1987. Since retiring from Murphy-Brown in December 2007, Randy and Gwen have moved to Raleigh, NC, where children and grandchildren live in the area. Today he stays busy consulting with several companies, serves on several boards and stays connected to his two contract sow farms.

Randy was an integral member of the "Our Future Begins Today" campaign team. "People who benefit from an organization should give back by contributing time or money," said Randy. "Given my career, I've never really been close enough to spend time with the undergraduates. No fraternity – not even AGR – can survive without alumni support.

"AGR had perhaps a bigger impact on me than kids today," Randy added. "I was a young man from Western Kansas, dropped off at the university barely knowing what to expect. Lo and behold I even graduated and was sent out into the world. AGR provided me with a great network of friends and colleagues, and by living in the house and having a leadership position, helped me learn the valuable lessons of tolerance and cooperation. As an employer for 40 years, I know that AGR has the raw material to make things happen.

"Alpha Zeta is nothing short of a turnaround artist in terms of what has been accomplished since the chapter house renovation," said Randy. "Today they have a stronger talent pool living in the house than what we had in the 1960s. The scholarship program has had a major impact here. Living in the university triangle of Duke, University of North Carolina and NC State, I know how scholarships can draw the best talent in the country. To survive and thrive in the future – where K-State is certain to be a Top 5 agricultural program – AGR will need a larger scholarship program to have the ability to attract the best and brightest from in-state and out-of-state."

A former Noble Ruler – as well as Rush Chair – Randy has issued a challenge to other AZ Noble Rulers to establish an endowed NR scholarship at the \$25,000 level. He's willing to donate \$5,000 this year and next if \$20,000 can be raised annually in 2014 and 2015. "With a total of \$50,000 we could award nearly \$2,500 annually to the chapter's Noble Ruler. Certainly we want to show our appreciation for the work they do by recognizing the position and responsibilities. Working with others who intimately know the demands and rewards of the position, this can happen."
