The Alpha Gamma Royal took place on Friday, March 27, 2021, at the Riley County Fairgrounds in Manhattan, Kansas. We had 115 head of cattle in attendance and more than 60 exhibitors from multiple states.

Brother Chase Spence came up with the idea in November and proposed it in chapter to bring back an AGR-hosted cattle show like similar to the previous Block & Bridle and AGR show our chapter helped host in years past.

The goal of the show was to host it as a philanthropy event to raise money for Cystic Fibrosis and to support the house. In total, the chapter raised about \$2,500 dollars.

The organizing committee who helped organize and host the show include Brothers Chase Spence, Wesley Denton, Gordon Clark, Stetson Herzog, and Levi Bradley.

One of K-State's own, judged the heifer and steer show, Hadley Schotte. He was a member of the livestock judging team at Hutchinson Community College and continued to Kansas State University where he was a member of the Reserve National Champion Livestock Judging Team. Hadley currently resides in Randolph, Kansas, where he works for Fink Beef Genetics

The show started at 9 a.m. March 27 with showmanship, followed by heifers, and concluded with steers.


Back to Back SGA Presidents
